
The RFI was designed to put forth strategic recommendations to the Board.

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Goals and Approach



Offshore wind (OSW) could be valuable but issues must be addressed to support viable contracting.

CC Power actions can help mature and direct industry readiness to enable future contracting.

- CA OWS not ready right now for major contracting
 - Barriers: unclear costs, timelines, supply-chain, work-force, permitting, ports, technology maturity, and transmission timing
- Several low-risk actions will help both CCAs and OSW industry
 - Large RFO at future expected date
 - 2025 2027
 - Significant size
 - Help industry to prep and plan
 - Reduce barriers with date-specific planning and progress
 - Collaborate w/ industry to de-risk, scale smartly, and address issues where state action(s) beneficial
 - Condition Precedent Structure, MOUs, or NDAs
 - Expand off-take ability if needed
 - Optional: explore near-term RFO but evaluate risks and costs of this approach before committing

Motion and Next Steps

See Resolution 23-06-05 Approval of Recommendations For Strategic Action Towards Offshore Wind Request For Offers.

- Next Steps: Return to Board with finalized strategic steps:
 - RFO scale and timing, with prospective off-takers MW estimates
 - Engagement plan with developers
 - Work-team plan to support project success, e.g. Community Benefits Agreements, inform port strategies
 - IRP inputs to inform transmission planning



Opportunities

Distill opportunities into one or more strategic actions, potential including RFOs.

- IRA opportunities may be beneficial to CCAs
 - Example: ownership benefits
- Work aggressively to understand, vet, and identify several possible strategic actions and deal-flow ideas for members
 - Sub-team: SJCE, PCE (tent.), VCE
 - Expert Legal Advisory support
- Considerations:
 - Where might ownership make sense?
 - For what technology or generation types should CC Power solicit?
 - What sequence of actions or procurements should be pursued?
- Estimated Timeframe:
 - June July Research IRA
 - August Evaluate Strategic Options
 - September Finalize Recommendations
