

California Community Power Issues Request for Proposals: Clean Generation and Capacity Resources

Responses due December 5, 2025

October 20, 2025 – California Community Power (“CC Power”), a joint powers authority representing nine community choice aggregators (“CCAs”) serving over 2.7 million customers and 30,000 GWh annually across California, today issued a Request for Proposals (“RFP”) to procure new cost-effective clean energy and reliability resources.

The RFP seeks proposals for clean generation and energy storage projects that can meet mid-term reliability, resource adequacy and Renewable Portfolio Standard (“RPS”) goals. Additionally, CC Power is interested in a range of projects for potential ownership, leveraging the benefits of the Inflation Reduction Act. Further, CC Power is seeking projects that can retain ITC eligibility by meeting the start of construction guidelines in the One Big Beautiful Bill Act (“O3BA”). CC Power is also seeking responses to its Request for Information track on emerging technologies such as gas with carbon capture, small modular nuclear reactors, hydrogen, and alternative storage technologies.
